Ann Claussen New CEO of Central Florida Health Care, Inc.

The Board of Directors of Central Florida Health Care, Inc. named Ann Claussen as the new chief executive officer, effective January 2, 2014. Ms. Claussen replaced Gaye Williams, who retired on Dec. 31st. Ms. Williams proudly served as the CEO for more than 20 of the 39 years she had worked for the organization. Ms. Williams was also a founding board member of the Heartland Rural Health Network, Inc. The Board of Directors named Ms. Williams "emeritus CEO," and asked her to continue to serve as a mentor and advocate.

Ms. Claussen takes over the CEO role after having served as chief

operational officer since June of last year and after being on the Board of Directors for five years. Ms. Claussen has prior experience in the health-care industry and a degree in health-care education, along with extensive connections to a variety of community resources related to hospitals, financing and governance. Her for-profit and broad non-profit expertise will help continue to strengthen Central Florida Health Care, whose mission is to increase access in medically underserved communities across the three county service area of Hardee, Highlands and Polk Counties.

Central Florida Health Care has added two new sites--one in Mulberry and one in Hardee-- all within the first quarter of the year. Their Lakeland practice moved from the old Parker Street address to a new one on Missouri Avenue.

CFHC's patient navigator program through its certified application counselors has seen more than 9,042 individuals being assisted. Currently, the certified application counselors are enrolling patients in Medicaid and the health insurance exchange.

Through its Joint Commission Accredited Patient Centered Medical Home program, the organization is engaging its patients and improving provider patient interaction through the utilization of information technology. The aim of the program is to improve patient well-being, produce better population health outcomes and reduce overall costs of care.

Highlands Regional Medical Center Welcomes New CEO

On April 2, Joseph Bernard became the new chief executive officer at Highlands Regional Medical Center, a 126-bed, full service medical facility. The hospital was acquired from Naples' Health management Associates by Tennessee-based Community Health Systems in 2013.

Mr. Bernard's previous hospital administration positions include Chief Operating Officer (COO) at Physicians Regional Healthcare

System in Naples, Florida and Peace River Regional Medical Center Joseph Bernard, HRMC CEO in Port Charlotte, Florida. Prior to becoming a COO, Mr. Bernard



was an Associate Administrator at Charlotte Regional Medical Center in Punta Gorda, Florida and Lehigh Regional Medical Center in Lehigh Acres, Florida.

He retired from the United States Marine Corps in 2005 at the rank of lieutenant colonel. During his 22-plus years of active duty, his assignments included: Presidential Aircraft Commander at Marine Helicopter Squadron One, Executive Assistant to the Director for Operations at the United States Pacific Command, Liaison Officer to the Central Intelligence Agency, and Executive Officer at Officer Candidates School.

Mr. Bernard has a master's degree in health administration from the University of Cincinnati, a master's degree in management from Webster University, and a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Massachusetts-Lowell. He is a current member of the American College of Healthcare Executives and the Military Officers Association of America, with a strong history of community and service organization involvement.

Mr. Bernard has a prioritized list of early goals including establishing a rapport with local physicians while looking to recruit additional physicians, work to privatize all rooms, and capitalize on the hospital's strengths. .

Tampa General Named One of the 100 Great Hospitals In America

Tampa General is one of two Florida hospitals listed in the 2014 "100 Great Hospitals in America" by *Becker's Hospital Review*, a national healthcare publication.



The publication's web site states the selected hospitals have rich histories, strong credentials and a growing focus on how to best care for patients in an era of reform. It also noted that the hospitals have made some of the greatest medical advancements in U.S. healthcare history, and serve as academic hubs or local mainstays in their communities.

The Becker's editorial team also conducted research and considered nominations and evaluated hospital ranking sources such as *U.S. News & World Report*, Truven Health Analytics' 100 Top Hospitals, Healthgrades, Magnet designation by the American Nurses Credentialing Center, The LeapFrog Group, and several other resources. The publication noted that last year, U.S. News & World Report rated TGH the number one hospital in Tampa Bay and one of the nation's Top-50 hospitals in six medical specialities. The magazine also mentioned the hospital's designation as a

Magnet hospital, which is the highest recognition a hospital can receive for quality nursing care. Also mentioned were TGH's disease specific certifications in 16 medical specialities from The Joint Commission and its ranking as the fifth-busiest heart transplant center in the nation. The only other Florida hospital to make the list is UF Health Shands Hospital in Gainesville.

Becker's Hospital Review features up-to-date business and legal news and analysis relating to hospitals and health systems and is geared toward high-level hospital leaders.

Effective **June 1st**, the Florida Medicaid Program is implementing a new system through which Medicaid enrollees will receive services. This program is called Managed Medical Assistance (MMA) Program.

In April 2014, all eligible Medicaid recipients will receive a letter with information about how to select and enroll in a managed care plan. Choice counselors are available to assist recipients in selecting a plan by calling, **1-800-226-2316**.

Pregnant women receiving Medicaid and need assistance in selecting a health care provider or need information about community resources in their area may call the MomCare Program staff at 1-866-796-0871 or 863-519-4700. Bi-lingual staff are available to assist consumers.

ACA Update: Network's Navigator Available for Special Enrollment Period

Open Enrollment for 2014 Marketplace coverage is over. Outside the Open Enrollment period, can enroll in a private health plan through the Marketplace only if you qualify for a special enrollment period.

To qualify for a special enrollment period the following must apply:

- You have a qualifying life event like having a baby, getting married, or losing other coverage.
- Victim of Domestic Abuse
- Medicaid/Marketplace Transfers
- Couldn't start or continue an application due to heavy traffic to healthcare.gov or the Marketplace call center
- Encountered maintenance periods that kept them from using the site
- Blocked by error screens or similar technical issues
- Tried to get an appointment with a Navigator or other application assister but they had no times available before the deadline
- Sent in an application by mail and didn't get an eligibility result by the deadline.

Consumers who experienced any of these issues are encouraged to contact Heartland Rural Health Network's certified ACA Navigator, Angela Hendry, to schedule an appointment to continue the



application process. Navigator services are free of charge. Angela can be reached at 863-452-6530 x 303.
